Judge Biographies

Tina Peixoto - FCI & AKC All-Breed Judge

My journey with dogs began in 1989, when the first Labrador Retriever to arrive in Latvia from a distant foreign country—**Sweettrees Mac**—came into my life. Bred in Belgium, Mac was a yellow male of outstanding type, with a classic Labrador head, strong bone, and a kind, balanced temperament. With roots tracing back to top lines in the USA and UK, he brought new genetic potential to Latvian breeding and became a widely used stud dog. To this day, his influence can be seen in the pedigrees of many Labradors.

In 2002, I established the kennel **Lattina Hope**, where I bred **Labrador Retrievers**, **Flat Coated Retrievers**, and **Newfoundlands** with a focus on breed type, health, and sound temperament. My passion for Flat Coated Retrievers began in 2005, and since then, they have become an essential part of both my breeding program and my life.

Since 2011, I have lived in Portugal, where I joined my husband Luis in combining our breeding efforts under the **Real Côte** affix. Together, we continue to breed and show Labradors and Flat Coated Retrievers, committed to maintaining excellence in type, conformation, temperament, and working ability.

Professionally, I am a **veterinarian** and a **licensed FCI judge since 2000**. In **March 2022**, I was approved as an **FCI All-Breed judge**, and in **2023**, I also became an **AKC All-Breed judge**. Over the years, I have had the privilege of judging in countries across **Europe, Asia, the Americas, and Oceania**, including the **USA, Japan, Brazil, India, Australia, New Zealand**, and throughout **Scandinavia and the Baltics**.

A highlight of my judging career came in **2023**, when I was honoured to judge the **Labrador Retriever Club of the Potomac Spring Specialty**—the largest single-breed specialty show in the world. Being entrusted with this prestigious assignment was a true milestone and a heartfelt tribute to the breed I hold closest.

I have judged in **Australia, Belarus, Belgium, Brazil, Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Gibraltar, India, Ireland, Italy, Japan, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxembourg, New Zealand, Norway, Poland, Portugal, Russia, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, Ukraine and the USA**. Each judging experience brings the opportunity to discover beautiful dogs, meet passionate breeders, and work alongside knowledgeable and dedicated fellow judges.

Every assignment is not only a professional responsibility but a personal celebration of the dogs we love and the global community that shares this passion.

Luis Peixoto – FCI & AKC Judge

My journey in the world of dogs began in 1998 when I brought home my first Labrador, Poolstead Pelagonium, from England. From that moment, my passion for Labradors grew, leading me to establish the kennel "Real Côte," with the aim of breeding and showing Labradors with excellence. Over the years, I imported influential dogs such as PTCH Newwin Tangerine and IntCH Lejie Cherry Pie, both of whom remain foundational in Real Côte pedigrees today.

My wife, Tina, joined me in the breeding program, allowing us to expand our focus beyond Labradors to include Flat Coated Retrievers, maintaining a strong commitment to type, conformation, temperament, and working abilities.

Beyond breeding, I am an international judge licensed by the FCI to judge all breeds in Groups 3, 4, 6, 8, and partial 10, as well as Best in Show. My judging assignments have taken me to numerous countries, including Portugal, Spain, France, Italy, Luxembourg, Finland, Sweden, Norway, Denmark, the UK, USA, Ireland, Gibraltar, Russia, Lithuania, Estonia, Poland, Czech Republic, Slovenia, Germany, Belgium, Brazil, Japan, Australia and New Zealand. While I am qualified to judge various breeds, the Labrador Retriever remains closest to my heart, having judged numerous national specialties and all-breed shows featuring the breed.

A highlight of my judging career was being invited to judge the Spring Specialty of the Labrador Retriever Club of Potomac, a prestigious event widely regarded as the world's largest single-breed specialty show, celebrating the highest standards of the breed and bringing together exceptional dogs and breeders from around the globe.

Alongside my judging activities, I serve as Vice President of the Portuguese Kennel Club and as a founding member of the Portuguese Retriever Club, where I actively contribute to the integrity of purebred dogs.

Each judging assignment is an opportunity to honor the breed's legacy, connect with breeders and exhibitors, and share my passion for purebred dogs. Being part of the international dog show community continues to inspire me to learn, contribute, and celebrate the exceptional qualities of these remarkable breeds.

Karen Brearley – Specialty Obedience Judge

My love for dogs began when I was very young.... I was always bringing home strays ...fortunately my mother shared this love of animals. My training experience began with horses...I trained several from the "ground up". When Steve and I were married we decided our family was not complete without a dog, so we purchased our first purebred dog, a Golden Retriever named Brew. He taught me many things but unfortunately his life was cut short. Next came my first Belgian, Belle who was my first competition dog. From there I got the bug and started competing not only in obedience but herding, agility and conformation.

Kaos was next.... He was my first conformation champion as well as obedience champion. My highlight with him was High in Trial at the 2002 Tervuren nationals in the U.S. with 82 dogs competing. George was my first toy dog, and it really has been an eye opener. His first time in the ring, George and I came home with a High in Trial. Although he earned his Canadian Championship, his Can and U.S. CD's and his U.S. RA... and is a St. John's Ambulance Therapy Dog, I was unable to continue training with him due to health concerns. Cleo aka FLEA, who has her Can Ch. One leg of her Open title and Rally Advanced titles also has health issues, so her training too was cut short.

I love playing on both sides of the fence and also judge CKC, AKC and ASCA obedience at all levels as well as Rally. I am also a CKC Herding Judge and have been an evaluator for the St. John's Ambulance Pet Therapy Program. I currently work for Citadel helping veterans and first responders with their service dogs. I truly enjoy watching the teams perform and can appreciate all the hard work that goes into getting into the ring. I love that dogs make us smile!

Kelly Ladouceur – Specialty Rally Obedience Judge

Kelly Ladouceur has been involved in dogs more than 20 years. She is a breeder, owner and handler of American Cocker Spaniels. Kelly and her dogs compete in conformation, obedience, rally, nosework as well as doing therapy visits and trick training. Kelly is a CKC rally obedience judge and an AKC scent work judge, as well as judging for other organizations. She has earned numerous titles on her dogs in both Canada and the US.

Fabian Negrón– Sweepstakes Labrador Retriever Club of Canada Specialty

Fabian Negrón’s journey with Labrador Retrievers began over two decades ago as a kennel manager and dog handler for Mary and Michael Wiest of Beechcroft Labradors. His passion for the breed quickly evolved into breeding, with his very first co-bred litter produced alongside them more than 20 years ago. In 2013, Fabian established his own breeding program under the prefix Gallivant, consistently producing Champions, Grand Champions, Best in Specialty Show winners, and Group 1 winners. Dogs bred and handled by Fabian have earned Best of Breed honors at many of the sport’s most prestigious events, including the Westminster Kennel Club Dog Show, the AKC National Championship, and the Potomac Labrador Retriever Specialty.

Mia Bjørnkov Juhl – Sweepstakes Labrador Retriever Club of Alberta Specialty

Mia’s introduction to dog shows began at a young age, handling German Wirehaired Pointers for her stepfather. This early exposure sparked a lasting passion for handling, leading her to show her first Labrador Retriever at the age of 20. She went on to earn championships in Denmark, Sweden, Norway, Germany, and the Netherlands with her dogs. In 2023, she relocated to the United States and joined her husband, Fabian Negrón, in breeding and exhibiting Labrador Retrievers under the Gallivant prefix. Most recently, she has achieved multiple Group placements, Best in Show and Best in Specialty Show wins, as well as Best of Breed at the AKC National Championship and Best of Winners at the Potomac Labrador Retriever Specialty with her beloved Everland Dance Party at Gallivant (“Party”).

Each Day is a separate show, and the above fees apply per day, per show. These fees include the CKC recording fees + 5% GST.

*TCN – Temporary Competition Number MUST be obtained from the CKC prior to entering any CKC event. TCNs will replace the previous system of entering events with dogs as “listed” and will allow dogs to temporarily participate in CKC events while they pursue permanent registration or an Event Registration Number (ERN). A TCN, MCN, ERN or CKC registration number is required for Baby puppies to enter, however the TCN entry fee is NOT paid on a baby puppy entry.

Should you wish to withdraw your entry between the time that you enter and the close of entries you will receive a full refund of entry fees (any Credit Card, Apple Pay, Interac or e-transfer service charges WILL NOT be refunded as per dogshow.ca policy.) Each day is a separate show, and the above fees apply per day, per show except as noted. (These fees include CKC recording fees + 5% G.S.T.) No entry or Merchandise Fees will be refunded after entries close, except for CKC Rule 6.5.

3. ENTRIES WILL BE ACKNOWLEDGED BY EMAIL after entry closing, with receipt, judging schedule and exhibitor passes. If such acknowledgement is not received one week before the show date, please contact the Show Secretary.
4. "It shall be the duty and obligation of the show-giving club to see that a judge, club official, volunteer or any participant at an event held under these rules is not subject to indignities" – CKC rule book, Section 19.7.
5. ENTRY FEES SHALL NOT BE REFUNDED AFTER THE CLOSING DATE if a dog is absent, disqualified, excused by Veterinarian or Judge, or barred from competition by action of Show Committee, or because it has been entered incorrectly. This includes any merchandise purchased. If because of riot, civil disturbance, or other acts beyond the control of the Club, it is impossible to open or complete the show, no refund of entry will be made.
6. ALL DOGS MUST BE KEPT ON LEASH WHILE ON THE GROUNDS. You are responsible for cleaning up if you permit your dog to relieve itself outside the show building. Failure to do so may result in being expelled from the building for one day's showing by the Superintendent.
7. All empty rings are to be kept free of dogs.
8. "ALL DOGS MUST BE KEPT UNDER CONTROL AT ALL TIMES." If not in competition the dog must wear a collar and be on leash a maximum of six (6) feet or appropriately confined in the benching area.
9. No Pinch Collars are allowed within the show precincts.
10. Dogs should be in the building at least one hour prior to ring time. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to be aware of the posted schedule and be at ringside at the time of judging. The club will not call individual dogs to ringside. Please remain at ringside until judging is completed.
11. If because of riot, civil disturbance, or any other acts beyond the control of the show committee, it is impossible to open or complete the show, no refunds shall be made!

EXTRACTS FROM THE DOG SHOW RULES - BREEDS, CLASSES, AWARDS AND STAKES

It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to be familiar with the conformation, Obedience and Rally Rules set out by the Canadian Kennel Club.

CONFORMATION CLASSES OFFERED:

12.2.1 Regular official classes at a CKC conformation show shall be as described in (a) to (k) of this section. All classes must be divided by sex (except for Specials Only). Only dogs entered in one of the regular, non-regular, or unofficial classes shall be allowed within the show precincts.

JUNIOR PUPPY: shall be for dogs at least six months of age and under nine months of age on the day of the show.

SENIOR PUPPY: shall be for dogs 9 months of age and under twelve (12) months of age on the day of the show.

12-18 MONTH - for dogs over 12 months of age but under 18 months of age. (Divided into 12-15 Month and 15-18 Month)

CANADIAN BRED: shall be for dogs born in Canada, Champions of any country excluded

BRED BY EXHIBITOR: shall be for dogs owned and handled in the ring by the Breeder. The handler must be the owner/co-owner AND breeder/co-breeder of the dog. The owner/breeder must handle the dog in this class but need not handle the dog for further awards.

OPEN CLASS: shall be for all dogs. (Divided by color: Black, Yellow and Chocolate)

VETERAN Dogs must be 7 years of age and over on the day of the show. Dogs entered in this class may be spayed or neutered. This class at a specialty MAY be divided by age. The winners of all the Veteran's classes will come back into the ring to compete for Best of Breed. (Divided by age - 7-9 Year, 9 - 11 Year, 11+ year)

FIELD: Dogs entered in this class must have attained a title or placement in a field trial or test. This class is to be judged prior to Best of Breed judging with winners of each sex competing for Best of Breed. Dogs entered in these classes may be spayed or neutered.

SPECIALS ONLY: is for dogs which have a recorded CKC Registration or Event Registration Number and have attained the required points for Championship status including at least one 2-point win either at the breed or group level. Should a dog which is entered in this class be found either not to be registered or has not completed the requirements for Championship status, all awards earned at the show will be cancelled. Dogs entered in this class will compete for Best of Breed, Best of Opposite Sex and Best Puppy if eligible.

UNOFFICIAL/NON-REGULAR CLASSES OFFERED

(with the exception of Baby Puppy all entries in these classes MUST be entered in a regular Class or as Exhibition Only)

BABY PUPPY Dogs 4 months of age and under 6 months of age on the day of the show. The awards for this class are: Best Baby Male and Best Baby Female Best Baby Puppy in Breed Best Baby Puppy in Group Best Baby Puppy in Show

BRACE At an all-breed or specialty show a club may, but is not required to, offer a Brace Class. This class shall be for 2 dogs of the same breed (not necessarily of the same sex). A Brace should be judged as an identical pair – same colour, size, gait, and same stride. When viewed from the side they should appear as one dog and its shadow. A brace must be handled by 1 person on 1 lead.

STUD DOG Stud dog and 2 or more of his get, not necessarily owned by the same owner. Get MUST be entered in a Regular Class.

BROOD BITCH Brood Bitch and two or more of her progenies, not necessarily owned by the same owner. Progeny MUST be entered in a Regular Class

GUN DOG CLASS: For all Labrador Retrievers who have earned a Certificate of Merit or better at a Licensed Field Trial, or who have received a Junior Hunter Title or higher, a Working Certificate or higher, in Canada or the United States by the close of entries.

OBEDIENCE CLASSES OFFERED (Labrador Retriever Club of Alberta on May 28th):

Novice A, Novice B, Novice C, Novice Intermediate, Open A, Open B, Utility A, Utility B, Pre -Novice, Exhibition Only, Team and Brace

RALLY OBEDIENCE CLASSES OFFERED (Labrador Retriever Club of Alberta on May 28th):

Novice A & Novice B, Intermediate, Advanced A & B, Excellent A & B, Masters, Exhibition Only and Brace

See **OBEDIENCE & RALLY OBEDIENCE TRIAL RULES AND REGULATIONS** for complete information on classes.

Attention Foreign Exhibitors: Please note that fees are due and payable in Canadian dollars. Due to consistently fluctuating currency rates, discounted cheques will not be accepted. Personal cheques will be accepted; however, they are to be payable in Canadian funds. If you send a cheque in US funds, it must be made out for the full amount of the entry, and no exchange will be refunded to the exhibitor. Please do not mark cheques "Payable in Canadian Funds" or "At Par". They will not be cleared by the banks. To simplify the process, we urge that you pay by credit card, bank drafts or money orders payable in Canadian funds. Your understanding and cooperation is appreciated.

Entries sent by Courier must be sent prepaid; To comply with instructions issued by the Canadian Kennel Club, we will be unable to accept any entry reaching our Show Secretary after the closing time and date.

Entries sent requiring a signature WILL NOT BE accepted.

Please allow ample time for delays in the mail.

Exhibitors Please Note: An exhibitor has the right to withdraw an entry at any time up to the closing date and time as published in the premium list. This may be done by telephone, but **written or electronic notification must be received by the show secretary not later than closing date and time.** If written or electronic notification is not received, the dog will remain entered in the show.

Section 4.1.5 No person may approach a judge either directly or otherwise, orally, in writing or electronically, to favour his entry. Disciplinary action will be taken against any person who violates this rule, or against a judge who fails to report any contravention of this rule to the CKC within 14 days of the action.

Section 9.9 Effective January 1, 2024

The CKC will not consider a request for any corrections to results if received more than 90 days following the date(s) of the event(s).

Section 19.7

19.7 It shall be the duty and obligation of the show-giving club to see that a judge, club official, volunteer or any participant at an event held under these rules is not subject to indignities. The Conformation Show Committee Chair shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation, and the CKC shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred. A copy of this regulation shall be prominently placed in every premium list and catalogue.

Entry fees will be refunded when a bitch entered in Rally/Obedience comes into season (CKC Rule 6.5) after the close of entries if a Veterinarian's Certificate (certifying that the bitch was in season within the 10-day period preceding the trial) is delivered to the Show Secretary **before the starting date and the time of the trial**. The Club will refund entry, recording and listing fees if the above conditions are met. No Refunds will be given for the service fees provided by the dogshow.ca

A 50% refund of entry fees only will be made for a bitch in season without a veterinarian's certificate with written notification presented to the Show Secretary at least ONE HOUR before the start of the Trials for Performance events ONLY. The bitch must be available to be examined by the Show Superintendent to verify she is in season.

There will be no refunds after closing of entries for any duplicate entries or overpayments.

Extracts From CKC Dog Show Rules

Chapter 8 Entries and End of Show Section

8.2.5 An error in an age specified class, date of birth or sex may be amended on the entry form up to one hour before the start of the show.

Section 8.3.1 Entries: Every dog entered in a Championship show must be one of the following:

- registered with the CKC,
- have an Event Registration Number,
- be eligible for registration with the CKC, or
- if it belongs to a listed breed, it must have a Miscellaneous Certification Number (MCN).

Section 8.4.1 Listed Dogs: If a dog is not registered as in 8.3.1 (a) or (b) but is eligible for registration with the CKC, it may be entered at a show as a listed dog provided:

- that if born in Canada, it is eligible for individual registration.
- that if not born in Canada, is eligible for registration in the records of the CKC.
- that if it is a foreign born and owned dog, an Event Registration Number or CKC registration number is obtained from the CKC within 30 days of the first show entered.

Section 8.4.2 Entry of a listed dog at a show must be accompanied by a listing fee as set by the Board in addition to the regular entry fee.

Section 8.5.1 Acceptance of Entries: If indicated in the premium list, an electronically transmitted entry may be accepted provided the entry is accompanied by a credit card charge authorization.

Section 8.5.3 No entry shall be accepted from or on behalf of any person who is officially known to be expelled, deprived of privileges, debarred or suspended by the CKC or any other registering body for pure bred dogs.

Section 8.5.4 After entries close, no further entries may be accepted, cancelled or substituted other than as otherwise stated in this section or as provided for in case of a postal strike.

Section 8.6.1 Refusal of Entries: The authorities of any show may:

- decline to accept entries for just cause, and/or
- refuse to receive or may remove any dog from the show building on account of disease or viciousness.
- in the case of non-acceptance, refund the fee with the reason for non-acceptance.

Section 8.8.2 Fees: Tendering of a dishonoured cheque or declined credit card in payment of an entry fee shall be considered non-payment of said fee and is an offense punishable by disciplinary action and cancellation of awards.

Section 8.9.1 Moving a Dog to Specials: A dog which is individually registered in the records of the CKC or that has a Miscellaneous Certification Number (MCN) and has completed the requirements for a Championship in accordance with these rules but at the time of the closing of entries for a show has not received confirmation of the title, may be transferred from one of the regular classes to Specials Only providing the transfer is submitted to the Show Secretary in writing by the owner or handler at least one hour prior to the opening of the show.

Section 8.9.2 If it is established that a dog transferred to Specials Only has not completed the Championship requirements, all awards will be canceled and all ribbons and prizes won shall be forfeited. The owner may also be subject to disciplinary action.

Section 8.9.3 When one or more All-Breed and/or Specialty Shows are held on the same day, in the same venue, the moving of class dogs to Specials must be made prior to the scheduled opening of the first show.

Chapter 4 Judges Section 4.1.3 A judge officiating at a show held under these rules shall not be subjected to indignities of any kind during the progress of the show. It shall be the duty and obligation of the club holding the show to see that this rule is effectively carried out.

Section 4.1.5 No person may approach a judge either directly or otherwise, orally or in writing, to favor his entry. Disciplinary action will be taken against any person who violates this rule or against a judge who fails to report any contravention of this rule to the CKC within 14 days of the act.

Chapter 14 Disqualifying or Excusing Dogs

Section 14.1.2 (a) At his discretion, a judge shall have the authority to excuse or disqualify a dog which menaces, threatens, attempts to bite or bites the judge, another person, or another dog in the ring. When a dog is twice excused on this account, it shall have the status of a disqualified dog.

(b) At his discretion, a judge shall have the authority to permanently disqualify a dog which bites the judge or another person in the ring. Dogs disqualified under this provision will not be eligible for reinstatement. The decision to permanently disqualify a dog must be clearly indicated on the Judge's Disqualification Form.

Section 14.1.4 Once a dog has been disqualified for any reason at a conformation show, it may not be entered or shown at another show until

the dog has been reinstated by the CKC. All awards earned by a dog shown in violation of this section will be cancelled by the CKC and the owner of the dog is subject to disciplinary action. A dog disqualified under section 14.1.2 (b) is not eligible for reinstatement.

Section 14.1.5 Any dog that is disqualified under section 14.1.2(a) shall automatically be disqualified from entering in any CKC event in any other discipline until such time as the dog is officially reinstated, if the dog is eligible for reinstatement.

Championship Points and Cancellations

Section 15.1.1 A dog awarded Winners at a conformation show shall be credited with a number of championship points (ranging from 0 to 5) and the number of championship points credited to a dog awarded Winners shall be as provided hereunder.

Section 15.1.2 The schedule to be employed in the determination of the number of points awarded Winners shall be as follows:

Dogs competing*	1	2	3-5	6-9	10-12	13 & more
Points allocated	0	1	2	3	4	5

*Includes the dog awarded Winners.

In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall NOT be included in the calculation for championship points.

Section 15.1.3 If a Dog awarded Winners was also awarded Best of Breed, then at the show all dogs competing in the breed, including Specials Only, shall be included the total.

Section 15.1.4 If a Dog awarded Winners is also awarded Best of Opposite Sex to Best of Breed, then all dogs of the same sex including those competing for Specials Only shall be included in the total.

Section 15.1.5 If a Dog awarded Winners is also awarded Best of Winners, then all dogs defeated directly or indirectly in the breed shall be included in the total.

Section 15.1.6 If a dog is awarded Winners only, then all the dogs of the same sex in the class competition shall be included in the total.

Section 15.1.7 The number of championship points to be credited to a dog awarded Winners shall be determined by the highest award earned and calculated as per this section.

Clarification: Example of directly or indirectly defeating: If the Winners Bitch is awarded Best of Opposite Sex but not Best of Winners, the Best of Winners Male shall be deemed to have indirectly defeated the Specials Bitches and is thus entitled to add them to the number of dogs and bitches defeated.

Section 15.1.8 In addition to championship points allocated at the breed level, a dog awarded Winners which also places in the regular Group competition shall be credited with the following additional points provided that the dog was defeated at the Group level.

Section 15.1.9 A dog may not be credited with more than 5 championship points in a single show:

Section 15.1.10 A breed or class shall not be allowed more than 2 sets of championship points per sex on any day in the same venue.

Section 15.1.11 A dog awarded Winners which also places Best in Show at an all-breed conformation show shall be credited with 5 championship points inclusive of any points earned at the breed and group level.

Section 15.1.12 In order for a dog to be recognized as a Champion and its owner provided with a Championship certificate, the dog must:

- earn at least 10 championship points under at least 3 judges; and,
- be individually registered in the records of the CKC or have an Event Registration Number.
- have earned at least one 2-point win either at the breed or group level.

15.2 Grand Champion (GCh)

15.2.1 The title of Grand Champion may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation championship.

15.2.2 Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the conformation championship and do not include the points earned in attaining the conformation championship.

15.2.3 To be awarded a Grand Champion title, a dog must attain a minimum of 20 points, which must include a minimum of two (2) wins of at least two (2) points each. Points may be gained at breed, group or Best in Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

(a) Grand Champion Point System

Points towards the Grand Champion title, are attained at breed level and are awarded to Best of Breed, Best of Opposite Sex, Select Dog and Select Bitch. Points are calculated based on the number of animals competing at the breed level for the Best of Breed winner and the number of similar-sex dogs competing for the other three (Best of Opposite, Select Dog, Select Bitch). The following schedule shall be employed in the determination of points awarded at breed level for all levels of GCh:

(b) the following schedule shall be employed in determination of points awarded at Group Level for all GCh:

c) In order to obtain a Grand Champion title, a dog must obtain at least two (2) points after 12 months of age.

In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for Grand Champion points.

(d) Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

15.2.4 Grand Champion Bronze (GChB) The title of Grand Champion Bronze may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion is attained.

Win	Points
Best in Show	5
Best of Breed at a National Specialty Show	5
Reserve Best in Show	4
Best of Breed at a Specialty Show (other than National)	3

(a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Championship, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship.

(b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Bronze title, a dog must attain a minimum of 50 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best in Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

(c) Points accumulated prior to July 1, 2021, may be used to attain the GChB title, however, a minimum of five (5) points must be earned after July 1, 2021.

15.2.5 Grand Champion Silver (GChS) The title of Grand Champion Silver may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Bronze is attained.

(a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Champion Bronze is attained, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Bronze

(b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Silver title, a dog must attain a minimum of 100 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

15.2.6 Grand Champion Gold: (GChG) The title of Grand Champion Gold may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Silver is attained.

(a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Champion Silver is attained, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Silver.

(b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Gold title, a dog must attain a minimum of 200 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

15.3 Grand Champion Excellent (GChEx)

15.3.1 The title of Grand Champion Excellent may be granted only after the completion of the CKC Grand Championship Silver Title. Exhibitors will be required to submit to Shows & Trials the Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet documenting the additional requirements. The Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet Form is located on the CKC website.

15.3.2 To earn the title a dog must have earned the following during their career as a Special:

(a) one (1) Best in Show or a Best of Breed at a breed national specialty (where a minimum of 10 dogs have competed)

(b) three (3) Group 1st, or three (3) breed specialty best of breed wins.

(c) a CKC performance title from any CKC Event. Titles excluded are: CGN, Herding Novice Tested Certificate, all Instinct titles from all events, as well as all Sprinter titles and all Chase Ability Program titles.

15.3.3 Best in Show, Best of Breed at a National Specialty, 3 Group wins, or 3 Specialty Best of Breed wins, must be attained after the completion of a regular championship. The performance title may be attained at any time in the dog's career.

NOTE: 1. Exhibitors are required to complete the Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet form located on the CKC website and forward to CKC upon completion of requirements above.

2. Grandfathering of the previous version of the Grand Champion Excellent title will be honoured up until July 1, 2022.
